- **Oregon Promise Grant** can cover tuition for any Oregon community college.
- **Integral Youth Services** offers internships, application supports, and job searching supports for Klamath County students. It also helps with housing for youth in the system or who receive McKinney-Vento services while attending post-high school education.
- **Merrill Rotary Club** sponsors many different scholarships, internships, and other opportunities throughout every school year.
- **Klamath County Transition Program** offers hands-on training, education, and can even cover the cost of tuition for courses at KCC for all county students receiving IEP services.

What about discrimination?

Under Title IX Law, "It is a policy of the State Board of Education and a priority of the Oregon Department of Education that there will be no discrimination or harassment on the grounds of race, color, sex, marital status, religion, national origin, age, sexual orientation, or disability in any educational programs, activities or employment" (ODE, 2023).
